# MTSU Faculty Options for Leading Education Abroad Programs in 2013-14!

# ISA Custom \*NEW\* cp.studiesabroad.com

- -Established third party provider with support system
- -Faculty make all curricula decisions, ISA organizes logistics, no "acceptance" necessary
- -Minimum of 7 students must be enrolled at MTSU in order to receive summer salary
- -Recruitment at other institutions is optional
- -Hours taught abroad count against summer teaching load
- -Programs can be offered as a Spring Break or Winter option as well, winter pay is the same as MTSU Faculty-Led
- -Limited to ISA locations, although other third party provider options are available
- -When starting a new program, it can be difficult to compete with established offerings

## KIIS - Kentucky Institute for International Studies www.kiis.org

- -Established consortia with support system
- -Faculty propose course and are considered by consortia for acceptance
- -\$2000.00 stipend from KIIS
- -No summer salary because students do not pay tuition to MTSU
- -Transportation, lodging, tours, most meals covered.
- -Must recruit from other institutions
- -Hours taught abroad do not count against summer teaching load

# MTSU Signature Faculty-Led

- -Independence from consortia/provider rules and formats, pre-prescribed activities, and curriculum
- -Faculty make all curricula and logistical arrangements
- -Minimum of 7 students must be enrolled at MTSU in order to receive summer salary
- -No need to recruit at other institutions
- -Hours taught abroad count against summer teaching load
- -Programs can be offered as a Spring Break or Winter option as well
- -When starting a new program, it can be difficult to compete with established offerings
- -Winter option: receive either 3 hrs overload or
- 3 hrs release time for spring semester after the class is completed if 7 students are paying for credit through MTSU (Winter pay is arranged through the faculty members' dept/college, contact <u>David.Schmidt@mtsu.edu</u>, Vice Provost for International Affairs, for more information).

# CCSA - Cooperative Center for Study Abroad

- -Established consortia with support system
- -Faculty propose course and are considered by consortia for acceptance
- -Minimum of 7 MTSU students must be enrolled in order to receive summer salary
- -\$30.00/day per diem through CCSA for most venues
- -Transportation, lodging, tours, some meals covered
- -Must recruit from other institutions
- -Hours taught abroad count against summer teaching load
- -Summer and Winter options available, winter pay is the same as MTSU Faculty-Led

### **DEADLINES!**

MTSU Course Proposal Final Deadlines for *new* programs:

- **-Winter13-14/Spring 2014 Programs**: Monday, February 4<sup>th</sup>, 2013
- -Summer 2014 Programs: Monday, September 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2013

# TnCIS - Tennessee Consortium for International Studies www.tncis.org

- -Established consortia with support system
- -Faculty propose course and are considered by consortia for acceptance
- -\$2000.00 stipend or a non-taxable per diem of \$1400.00 from TnCIS
- -No summer salary because students do not pay tuition to MTSU
- Transportation, lodging, tours, meals covered
- -Must recruit from other TBR institutions
- -Hours taught abroad do not count against summer teaching load
