DAKAR

Presidential Palace, Marche Kermel, Dakar Cathedral, Universite Cheikh Anta DIOP and IFAN Museum

GOREE ISLAND

Goree Island played a key role in the implementation of the Atlantic Slave Trade and is one of the oldest European trading posts in Africa

THIES

City very well known as the French colonial railroad center, linking Bamako (former French Sudan) to Dakar (Senegal)

SAINT LOUIS OF SENEGAL

The old French city, Djoudj Park, Universite Gaston Berger, and Langue des Barbaries

TOUBA

Capital of the Mouridism and black Islam of Africa

JOAL-FADIOUTH

Sea and wildlife (central Senegal)
